Tsay Keh Dene apply for protected area

An area of land west of Williston Lake encompassing parts of the Ingenika and Swannell watersheds may be withdrawn from resource activities pending an application by the Tsay Keh Dene for an Indigenous Protected and Conserved Area (IPCA).

Called the Wədzih Yine', which translates to Caribou Song, the 110.535-hectare area has historical, ecological, and cultural significance to the band. It also purportedly contains critical caribou

habitat

An IPCA would give the Tsay Keh a primary role in directing management plans and governance structures for the area.

Currently the band is applying for a Section 17 Conditional Withdrawal with the Ministry of Water, Land and Resource Stewardship to support the IPCA application.



According to Land and **Environmental Coordinator** Luke Thorne, a meeting has not yet taken place.




PESTICIDE USE PERMIT # 233-0024-24/26

Pesticide Use Permit (PUP) # 233-0024-24/26 allowing for the treatment of larval black fly populations at Morfee Creek, located approximately 1.5 km north of the District of Mackenzie town centre has been approved BC Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

The purpose of this annual program is to reduce localized black fly annoyance for residents and visitors of the District of Mackenzie. The proposed duration of the PUP is from 01 May 2024 to 30 September 2026. The only black fly larvicide product to be used is VectoBac 1200L (PCP # 21062) which contains the natural-occurring soil bacterium *Bacillus* thuringiensis var. israelensis. VectoBac 1200L would be mixed with water on-site and applied to Morfee Creek using a calibrated drip bar or by slow steady pour across the stream width. The total area to be treated each season is estimated at 0.6 - 2.0

More information on the control program can be obtained, or a copy of the approved Pesticide Use Permit, its application package and maps, are available through the District of Mackenzie Public Works office, #1 Mackenzie Blvd., Mackenzie, BC V0J 2C0, (250) 997-8183, Facsimile (250) 997 4381.
