Dog signage improvement?



Williston update

The March update for the Williston Reservoir has expected levels between 2155 feet and 2160 feet, higher than the forecast provided last month.

BC Hydro says the increase in expected levels is due to addi-

tional system precipitation, milder March weather, and continued imports of power.

The report forecasts Williston to be above 2150 feet during its spring minimum:

'…[O]perating below 2147 feet is now very unlikely."

Rec Access program expands

A family of four with a household income of less than \$51,128 will now qualify for an Access pass at Rec Services. For individuals, the qualifying income level is \$27,514 or under.

Changes to the policy raising the income levels and adding Little Mac Ski Hill to the pass were approved by Council at the last meeting, after some discussion. Councillor Wright objected to the requirement to provide a Notice of Assessment, stating that these are not

always an accurate indicator of current income.

The pass, which residents must apply for, waives Rec Services drop-in fees.



A solar eclipse, when the moon blocks out the view

of the sun from earth, will take place across North America April 8.

The path of the moon's total shadow will travel from the Pacific side of Mexico around noon Central time, traveling northeast and exiting the continent through Newfoundland around 4:40 pm EDT. Northern BC will only see a partial eclipse, with the moon covering about 14% of the sun,

starting at around 10 am.

The town of Niagara Falls in Canada is expecting thousands of visitors to view the eclipse that day.

The eclipse occurs at around 19 degrees Aries. Astrologers say everyone will feel the effects but people with birthdays around the 7 - 9 of April, July, October and January may be more personally affected.

People born on the 7 - 9 of June, August, November and February may notice some beneficial boosts from the planetary aspects.
